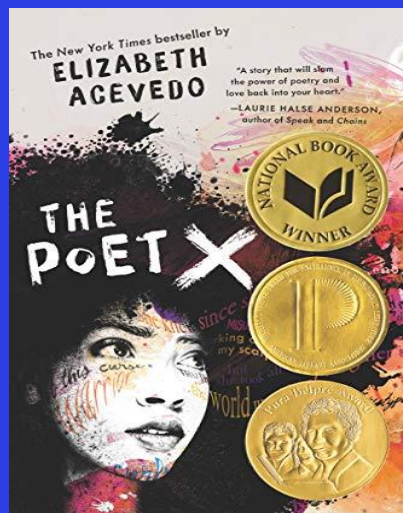

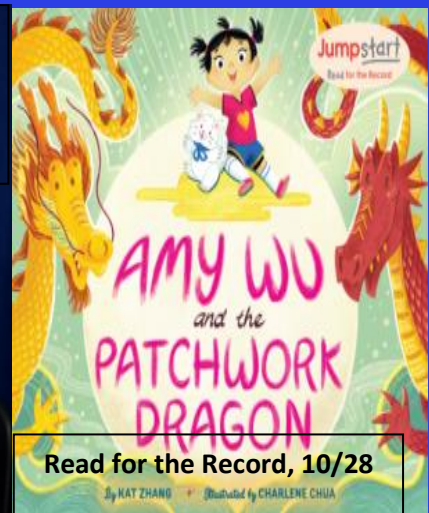
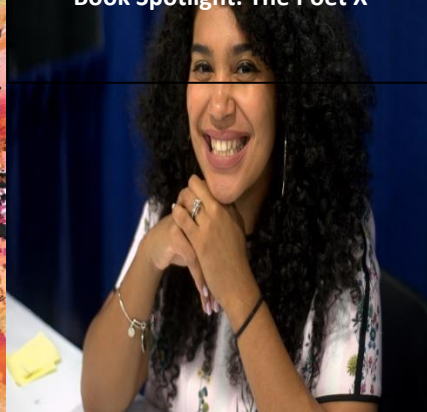

How do I sign up for the e-Appeal?

Fill out the form. Even if you used the NIE's e-Appeal or e-Edition last year, you will need to sign up again, since teachers and formats have changed. When it asks how many licenses you need, please enter a number equal to the number of students you teach at any one time. This number should be 25-35 or less.

Go to the GMIE web page, <https://gannettmediaeducation.gannett.com/> (bookmark this page) and click on the first "click here" link in the last sentence on the page.

Complete the following steps:

- 1) Select my newspaper – Memphis Commercial Appeal
- 2) Request sponsored licensed to e-Newspaper by clicking the link 'CLICK HERE'
- 3) Last day of classes is: May 27, 2022
- 4) End date for your subscription: May 13, 2022
- 5) Fill out the form and select 'SUBMIT'

How soon after registering will I get access?

Upon completing the form, we will receive it on our system and someone from the team will be in touch with you via email with the USER ID and Password.

At the end of the term you will receive an affidavit by email that you must fill out and send back.

The affidavit confirms you requested and received access to the GMIE website.

How do my students log in?

You will receive a username and password that you will provide to your students.

Can students and teachers access the e-Appeal in other places than at school?

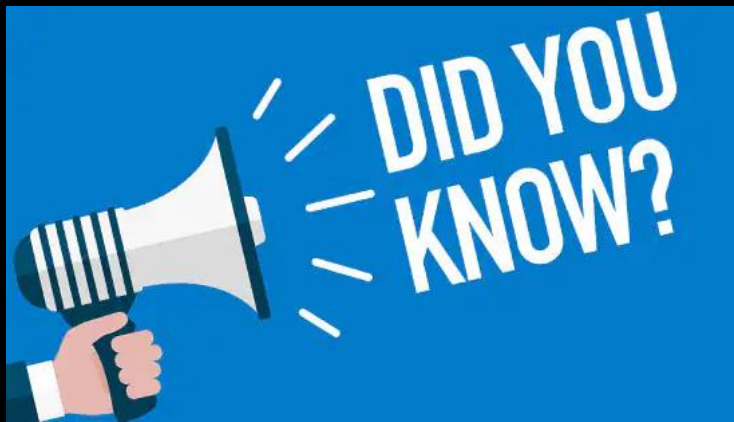
Students and teachers can access the e-Appeal any place where there is Internet access. Students can log in at home, public libraries, the computer lab, the school library, etc. This allows teachers to e-mail articles and extra credit or homework assignments to their teacher's web page or to students' homes




From Library Services:
